

Constitution of the Anti-Slavery Society in Guilford. 1841.

Preamble.

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Whereas, American Slavery is a great moral and political evil, powerfully operating to dry up the springs of industry and the sources of national wealth, to corrupt the nation's morals, and ruin souls: and whereas we believe it must be removed by the application of moral and political means, through the diffusion of light and truth: we, the undersigned, have concluded to form ourselves into a society for the purpose of laboring more successfully for its immediate abolition.

Constitution.

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Art. 1st. This society shall be called the Guilford Anti Slavery Society, auxiliary to the New Haven County Anti Slavery Society.

Art. 2nd. The objects of this society shall be by all proper moral and constitutional means to extend to the free colored people their moral, intellectual and civil rights, and to effect the speedy abolition of slavery.

Art. 3rd. The officers of this society shall be a President, two Vice Presidents, a Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall constitute an Executive Committee.

Art. 4th. Any person may become a member of this society by subscribing his, or her, name to the principles of this Preamble and Constitution.

Art. 5th. The officers of this society shall be chosen regularly at the annual meeting, and this constitution may be altered

at any annual meeting by a vote of two thirds the members present at the time.

Art. 6th. The annual meeting of this society shall be holden on the second Monday of September.
