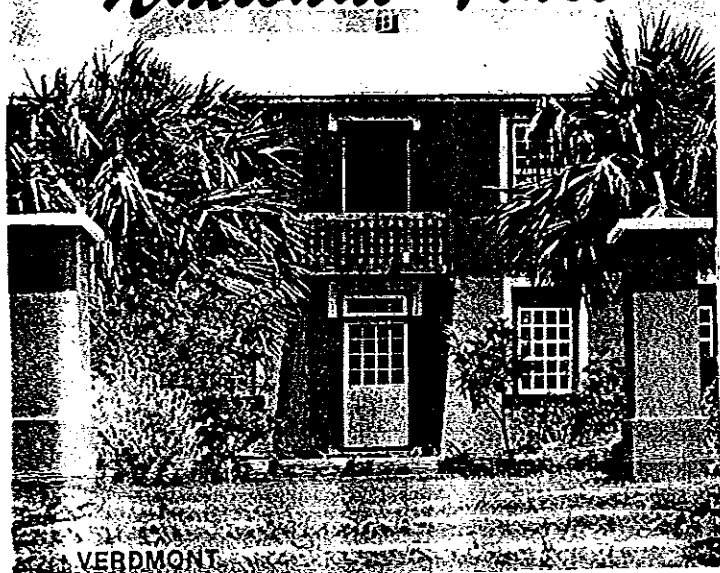

HISTORIC HOUSE MUSEUMS

VERDMONT (Pictured above. Collector's Hill, Smith's Parish. Tel. 6-7369) is a fine late 17th century mansion containing antique furniture including many Bermudian pieces, china and portraits. The cedar stair balustrade is considered the finest on the Island. Vermont is the most important of the Trust houses. Open weekdays 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission \$2.00*

CONFEDERATE MUSEUM in the GLOBE HOTEL (King's Square, St. George's. Tel. 7-1423) The former Globe Hotel (1698) was the headquarters of the principal Southern agent in Bermuda mainly concerned with procurement (including blockade running) during the American Civil War. Contains an interesting exhibit about this glamorous period. Open weekdays 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission \$1.50.*

TUCKER HOUSE (Water Street, St. George's. Tel. 7-0545) Home of distinguished members of the well-known Tucker family of England, Bermuda and Virginia. Notable collection of Bermudian furniture, portraits and silver. Also in the Tucker House is the Joseph Rainey Memorial Room, where the first black elected member of the House of Representatives in Washington, D.C., a refugee during the American Civil War, practised barbering. Open weekdays 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission \$2.00.*
